




RECOGNISE SHIFTING TRENDS AND DEVELOPMENTS

The situations in Afghanistan, Iraq and Syria demonstrate the evolving nature of non-state actors. Alliances, personnel, tactics and targets change and change again in response to events, meaning that what is true today is unlikely to be true tomorrow. Analysts need to understand intimately the direction and the pace of change, and to project likely futures and scenarios in order that decision makers can develop meaningful plans.

IHS events data enables analysts to conduct longitudinal analysis to monitor changes in factors such as tactics, targets and areas of operation over time, and IHS analysis of scenarios, futures and non-state armed groups provides specific qualitative indicators of the changing nature of terrorist and insurgent activities.

- Conduct longitudinal time-difference analysis with archived data
- Monitor changes in non-state armed group activities
- Develop contextual analysis of broader factors affecting groups, countries and regions







SUPPORTING AND AUGMENTING CLASSIFIED SOURCES

Analysts must draw on a range of information channels in order to carry out robust all-source analysis, but many sources are inherently unreliable. While in-country sources and informants might provide invaluable local information, there is often no way that an analyst can be sure that the information provided is accurate, timely or even credible. In order to deliver valuable intelligence, analysts need to verify and validate their own sources against a reliable third party.

All IHS data and intelligence is gathered from open sources and verified against primary or multiple reliable secondary sources, which means that analysts can trust IHS to verify, validate and expand upon their primary and classified sources of intelligence.

- Verify and validate intelligence gathered from other sources – HUMINT, SOCMINT
- Augment classified sources with reliable OSINT
- Declassify classified intelligence for dissemination and wider briefing



DELIVER ACTIONABLE INTELLIGENCE

Requests for intelligence arrive both regularly and without warning, and analysts must be able to package and deliver intelligence quickly and in a format that is easily digestible by multiple audiences.

Whether data or qualitative analysis, IHS information and intelligence on events, non-state armed groups and national terrorist and insurgent risk factors has been designed to be quick and easy to export and incorporate into reports and briefings.

In addition, IHS terrorism events data is structured so that it can be easily digested into and integrated with other data within third-party platforms such as intranets, simulations, models and C2 systems.

VISUALIZE COMPLEX INFORMATION





- Integrate data quickly and seamlessly into databases, models and simulators






NEW ENHANCEMENTS

Open-source intelligence is vital to all-source analysis and the creation of a robust intelligence product, but its exploitation is inherently challenging: the volume of information is overwhelming, and identifying valuable intelligence in the noise can be difficult. IHS has implemented new features to help analysts filter and discriminate within IHS Jane's Terrorism & Insurgency Centre.

OSINT OPTIMIZATION

- Events are often reported with some details omitted or with some uncertainty, and databases are typically unable to reflect this nuance; the new database contains qualifiers that enable IHS analysts to indicate whether certain fields are exact or minimum/maximum estimates
- Noise is a significant challenge for those dealing with OSINT, so a new Event Significance qualifier for each record (e.g. common>notable>significant) enables IHS analysts to provide an estimate of relevance to help users sort and filter more effectively






NEW GRANULARITY

The events database in IHS Jane's Terrorism & Insurgency Centre contains a vast amount of information, and its restructuring has introduced even greater levels of granularity to what was already an exhaustively detailed resource – enabling users to perform new and more powerful analysis functions.

Greater segmentation of a group's targets, providing sector, sub-sector, object and nationality – e.g. Security Forces > Ruling Political > Vehicles: Land > Afghan




- A new range of fields describes casualties, enabling differentiation between civilian, militant and security forces
- New detail on terrorist group statements including threats, claims, ideologies – and counter terrorism statements – including legislation, briefings, policies. The medium (e.g. video, public speech) is also recorded
- New Tactics and Weapons fields, to enable greater detail on attack methods, such as vehicle-borne heavy machine gun vs air-mounted heavy machine gun
- New linkages between events, so that related and extended events are more clearly delineated – for example, a kidnapping operation and the subsequent release of hostages



OPERATIONAL EVOLUTION

The operations of non-state actors and counter-terrorist organizations alike are continually evolving, spreading into new conceptual, physical and technological environments. The IHS Jane's Terrorism & Insurgency Centre events database has been enhanced to reflect even more faithfully the changing nature of the terrorism landscape.

- New database fields added to record IEDs and VBIEDs, reflecting their increased use
- New fields added to record the use of UAVs and UGVs in counterterrorist operations
- New fields added record the operational environment in which the incident took place, to reflect the changing mix of urban, rural and even cyber terrorist environments






GEOLOCATION

IHS Jane's Terrorism & Insurgency Intelligence Centre events data is now optimized for use in GIS systems, enabling users to carry out data visualizations such as heatmapping and area of effect analysis.

New Location Quality field captures the level of accuracy to which the event was tagged (e.g. Point > Section > Town > Area > Region > Country)



 All events database records are now geocoded to enable mapping, visualization and analysis in IHS, customer proprietary and thirdparty GIS systems
