Technical Requirements

Jane's Online is compatible with Microsoft Internet Explorer 8 and above, Firefox and Chrome.

Enable the following browser functions: Cookies, JavaScript, Frames, and preferably Cache.

Adjust your pop-up blocker to allow IHS Markit website pop-ups.

If you select "Remember Me" you will be automatically logged into the website on future visits until you clear your cookies and passwords via your browser.

Shared vs Individual Accounts

Depending on your organisation's preferences you may be set up as part of a shared account by default. If this is the case, once you have logged in, you can set up an individual account by going to the "Create Personal Account" link in the top right hand side of the web page. 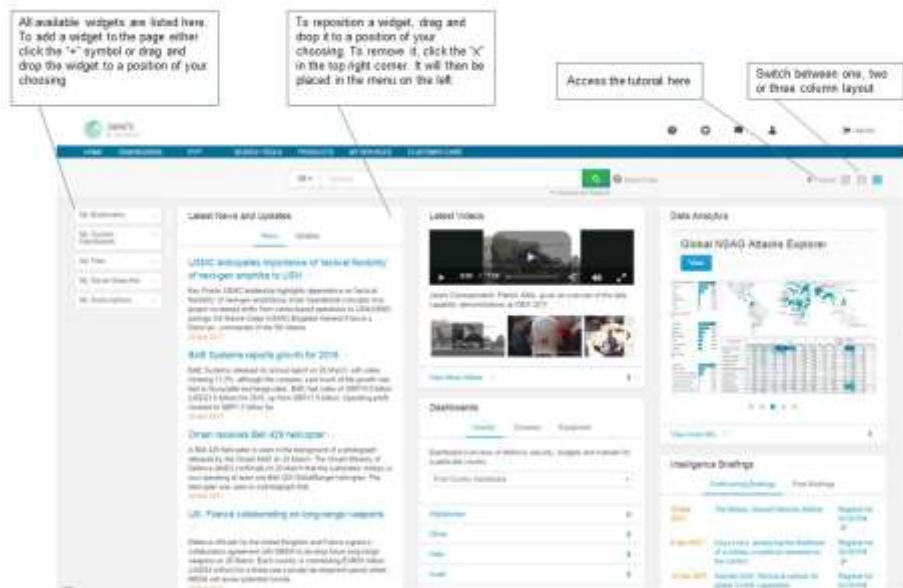
Individual profiles allow additional features and benefits such as:

Customising your Homepage

The homepage is designed to be customised to meet your requirements. The first time you land on this page a tutorial will appear which walks you through how to customise the page. You can access this tutorial at any time by clicking on the “Tutorial” icon in the top right of the screen just below the banner.

Your selections will persist from session to session. A number of “widgets” (content blocks) are available, which allow you to quickly and easily access commonly used functionality or content.



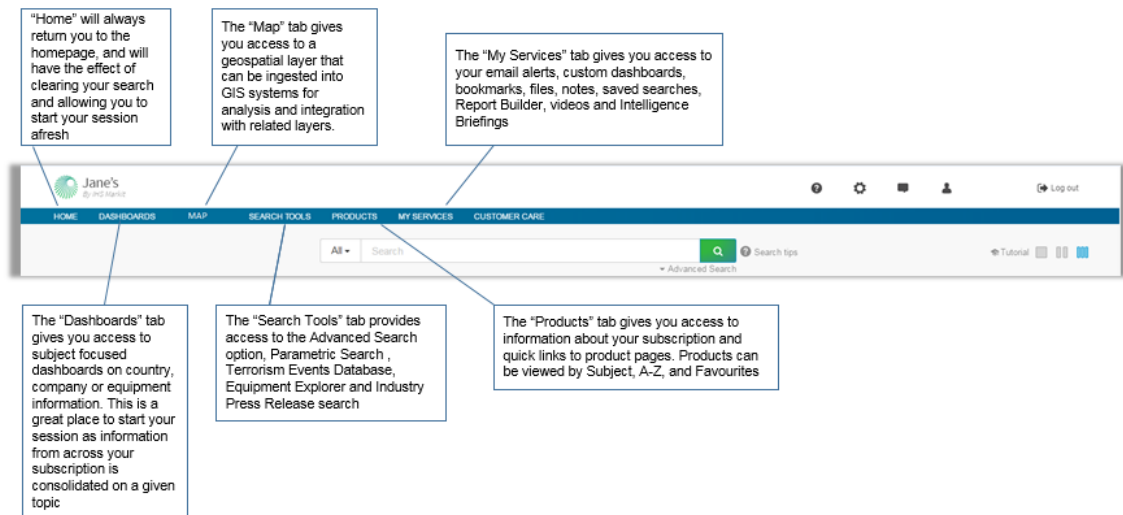

Top Navigation

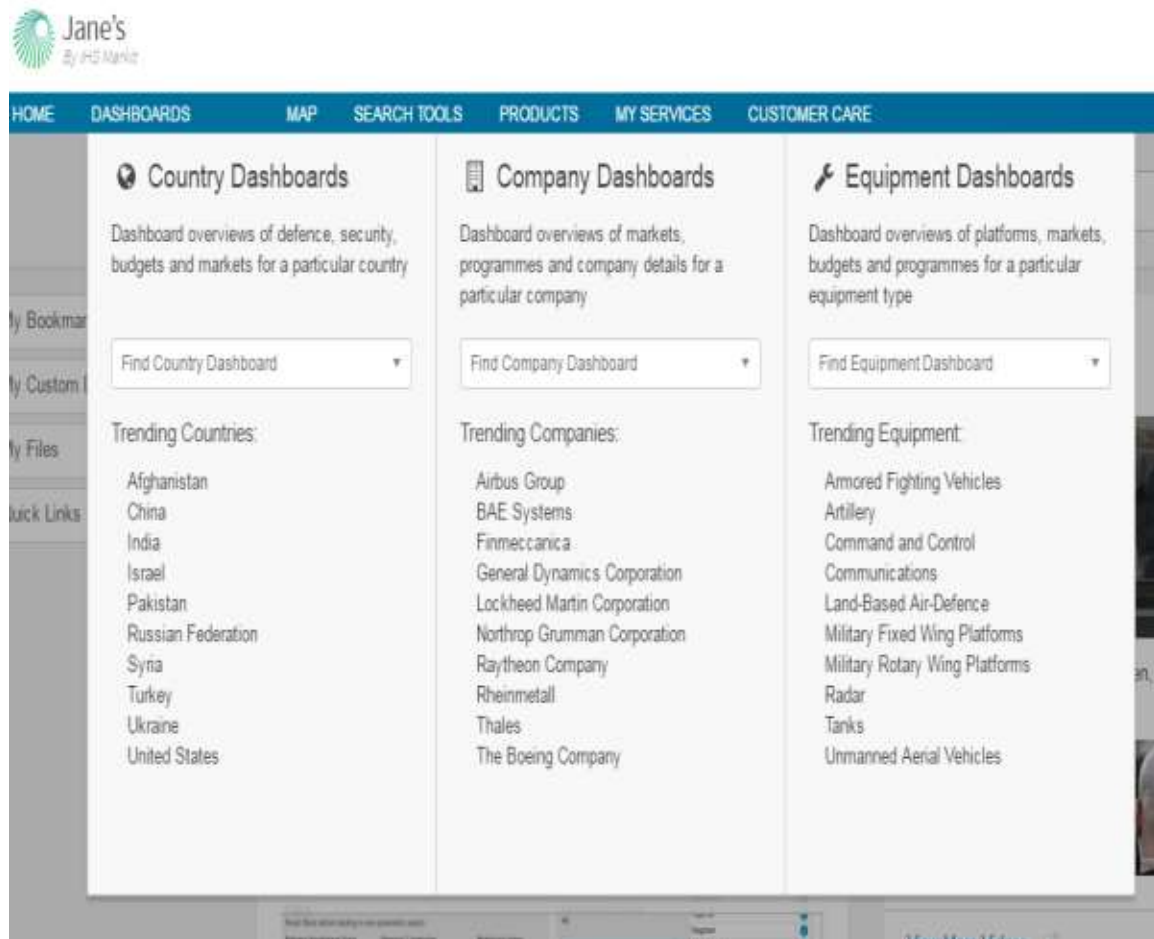
The top navigation refers to the blue bar at the top of the screen. This blue bar will persist as you navigate the site, and will allow you to access key pieces of functionality and content.



Accessing Dashboards

There are dashboards on Country, Company, and Equipment information. The dashboards consolidate content from across your subscription into one place, focused on a given subject – they are a great place to start your search as they negate the need to search and navigate numerous products.

You can access dashboards through the “Dashboards” tab in the top navigation. When you click on this tab you will see options for company, country, and equipment dashboards. To go to a dashboard you can either select from the full list of available options presented in the drop down menu or select from the quick links displayed. The list of quick links consists of our most popular searched content.

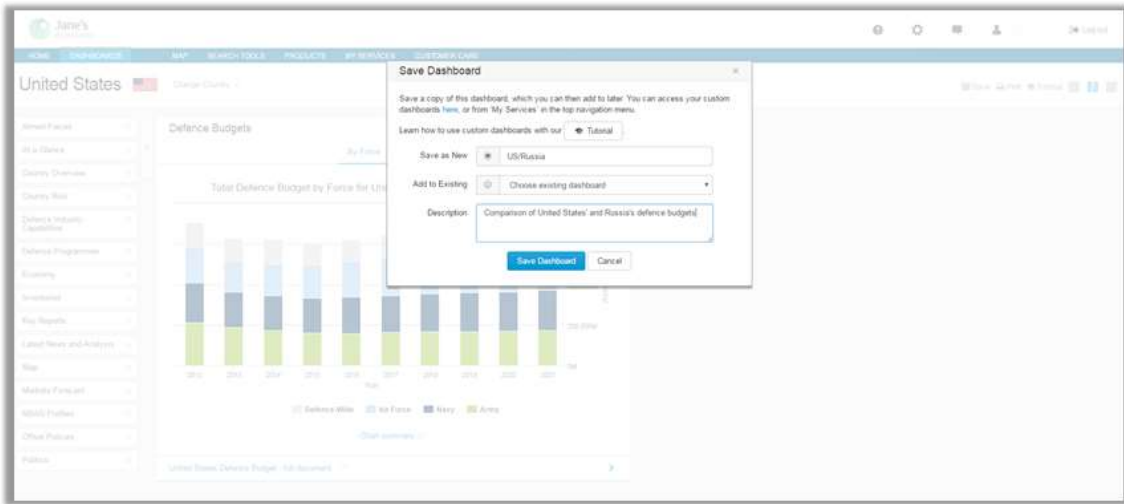

Saving Custom Dashboards

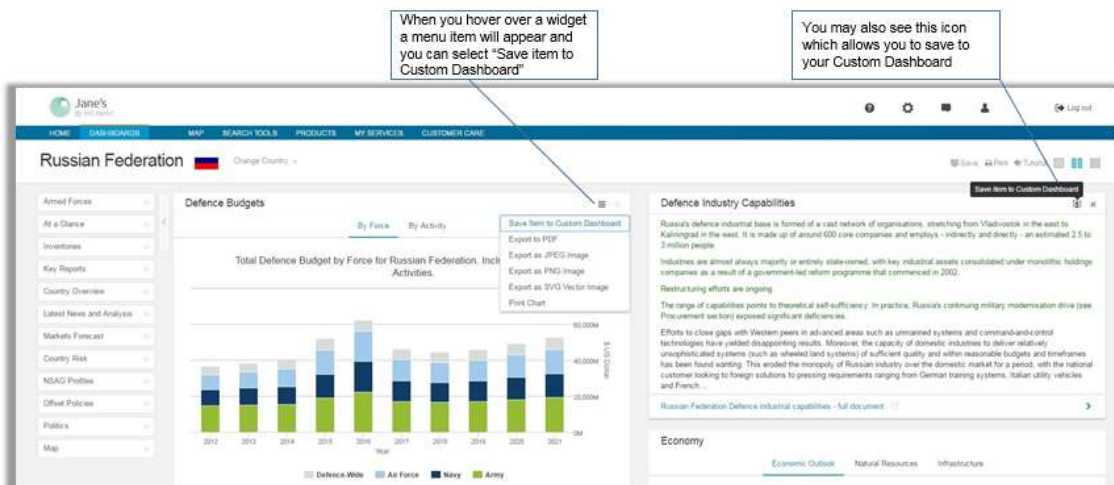
Users with Individual Profiles set up can create custom dashboards, by saving a view and adding widgets from other dashboards. This is perfect for creating a comparison, or setting up a view that reflects your workflow or task.

The example below shows how to create a custom dashboard that acts as a comparison between the economies of the United States and Russian Federation.

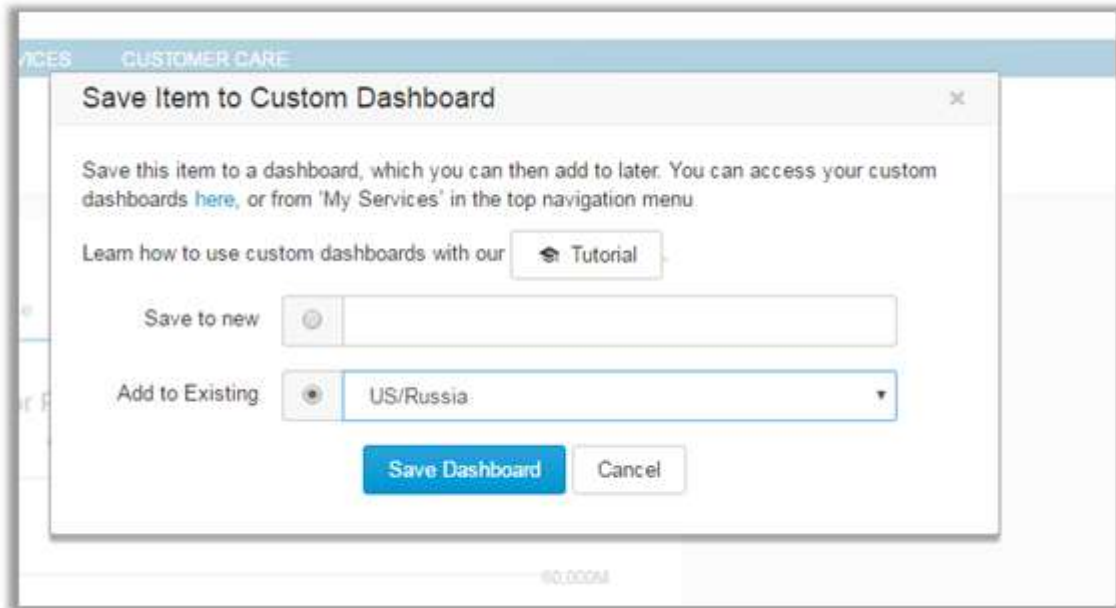
The first step was to add the widgets of interest to the United States Country Dashboard. Then select the “Save” icon at the top right of the dashboard. A pop up will appear allowing you to create a new custom dashboard. Add a title, and if required, a description. Click “Save Dashboard”.



Then move to the Russian Federation country dashboard. The same widgets will appear. When you hover over a widget a menu item will appear and you can select “Save item to Custom Dashboard”.



A pop up box will then appear and you need to choose “Add to existing” and select existing custom dashboard you have set up. Then click save.



Once you have added all the widgets required you can access your custom dashboard, either from the “My Services” tab on the top navigation, under “Custom Dashboards” or via the “Custom Dashboards” widget on the homepage.

As you can see from the screenshot below this creates a very easy to use comparison between countries.



Using Dashboards

All the dashboards work in the same way and have the same functionality, but the following examples are taken from the United States Country Dashboard.

Dashboards are customisable and whatever changes you make for one country will persist each time you visit the site and as you switch between countries.

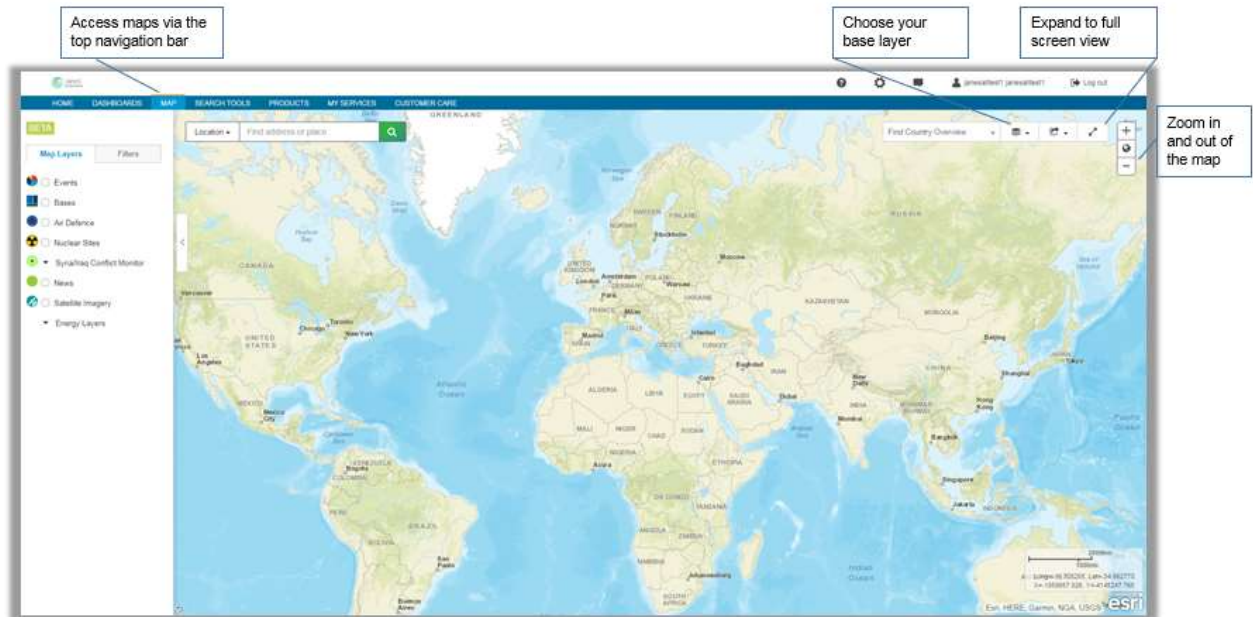
The first time you land on the page a tutorial will appear – you can revisit that tutorial at any time by clicking on the tutorial icon on the top right hand side of the dashboard.

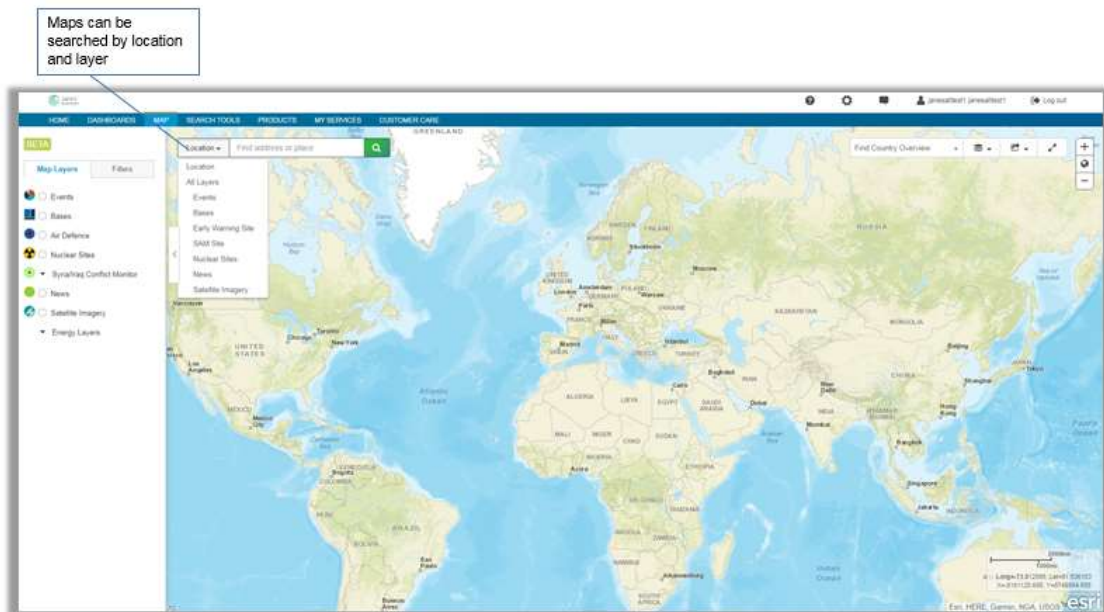
Accessing, Searching and Exporting Maps

You can access maps through the “Maps” tab in the top navigation. The maps provide a geospatial environment to display Jane’s layers. The geospatial layers available will depend on your subscription access.



Searching Maps

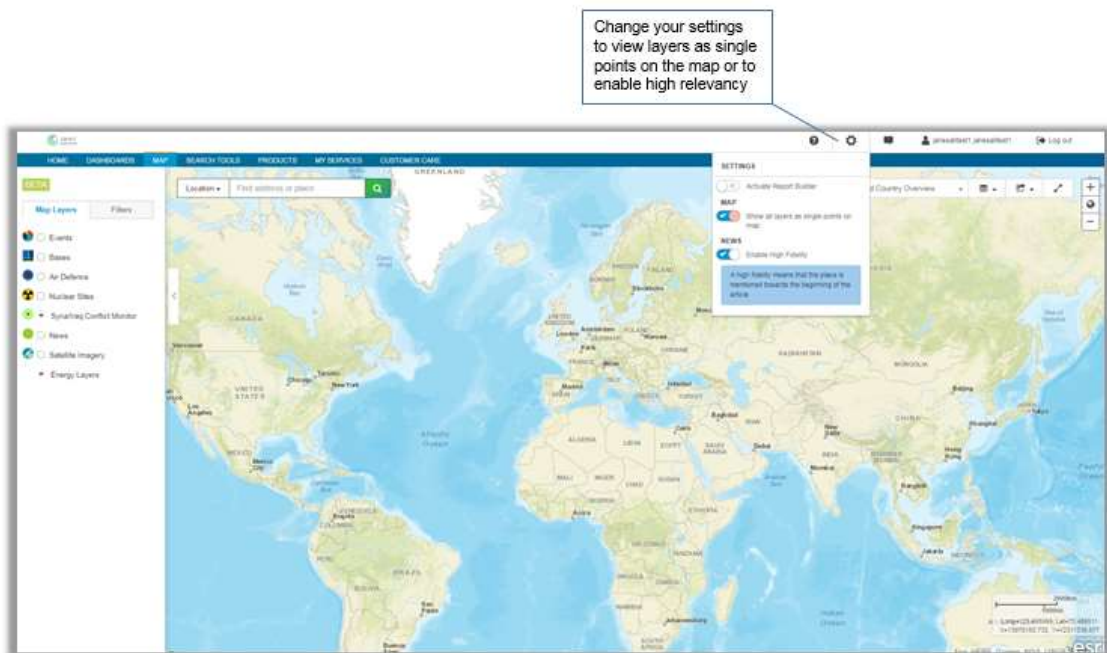
The maps can be searched by location and also by layer using the drop down menu.



You can also search for keywords on individual layers and select your time period



Change your settings to show all layers as single points on your map and to enable high relevancy. High relevancy means that your search terms will appear near the beginning of the news article, to ensure that it is relevant.



Country Overviews

Access the country overviews using the drop down menu.

Exporting Maps

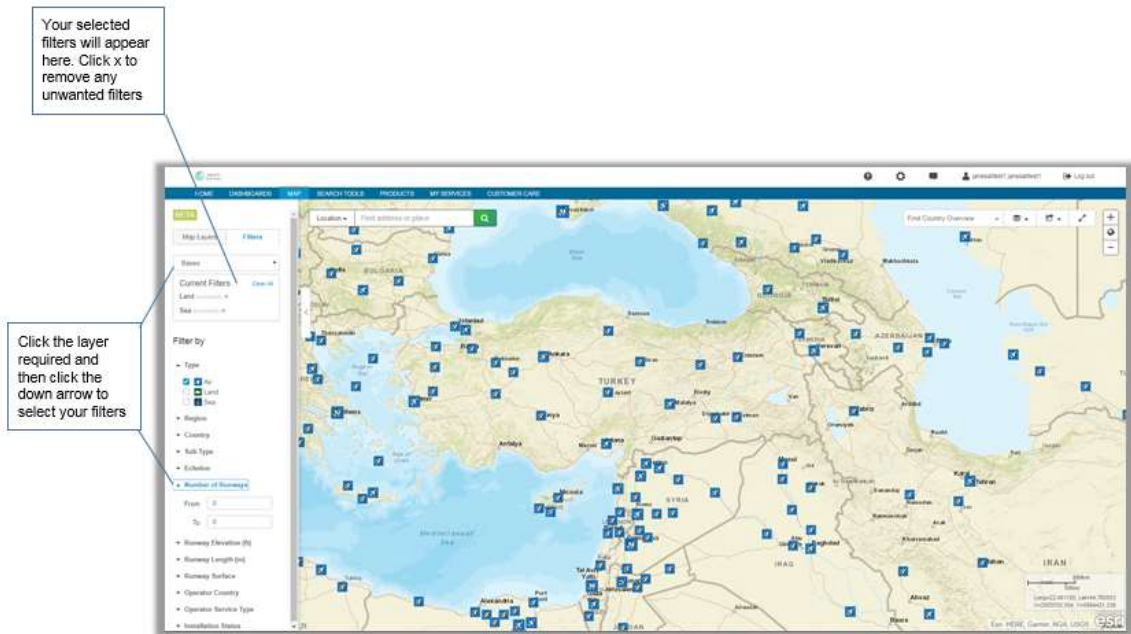
You can export data by layer (geopackage or SHAPE file) and download the map as an image.

Map Filters

To view each layer check the select box. If additional layers are available these will appear below each heading. When each check box is selected a filter icon will appear enabling you to filter against the selected layer.



Filters enable you to query the attributes against each geospatial layer. Select the layer required and click on the down arrow to select your required filters. Your selected filters and layers will appear in a box above, to clear your filters either select "clear all" or delete each filter separately by clicking the x



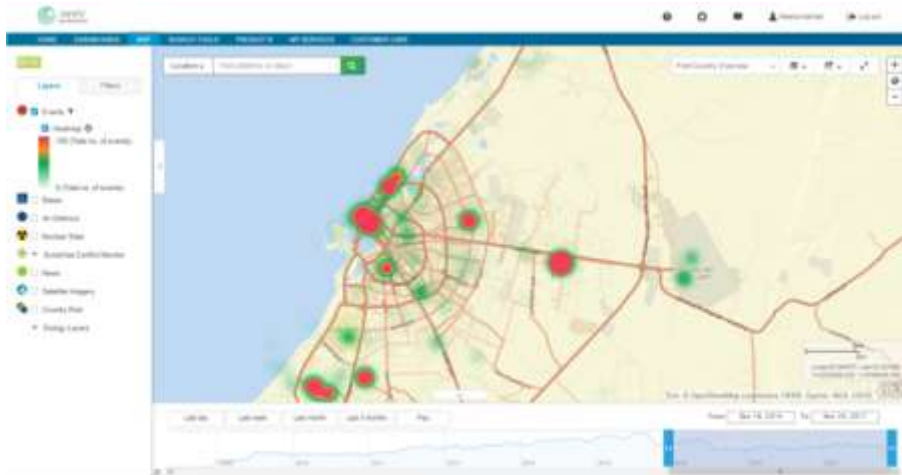
Map Tools

A number of tools are available within the map.

- Heat maps
- Thematic maps
- Ability to record Lat Long coordinates and conduct map measurements
- Create polygon search areas
- Set up saved searches and email alerts based on the custom area

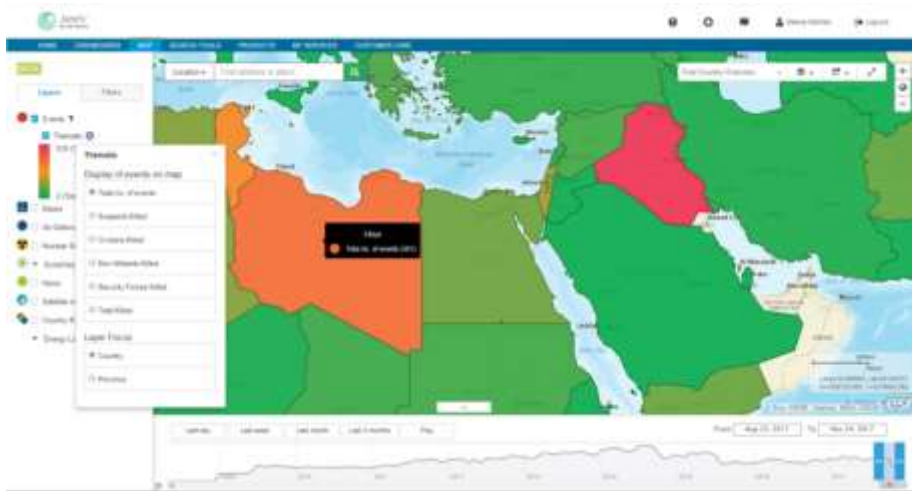
Heat maps

Linked to temporal tools, access millions of data points across 500,000+ events to examine change over time. You can also examine data across various tactics and export your results.



Thematic maps

Linked to temporal tools you can query across multiple data sets and make comparisons within specific regions.



Recording Lat Long Coordinates and Map Measurements

Select unit either area or distance.



Click, drag and double click to complete a measurement. Select copy to save to your report.



Create Polygon Search Areas

Create polygon search areas and set up saved searches and email alerts based on the custom area.

Select the polygon icon and "Draw custom area search"

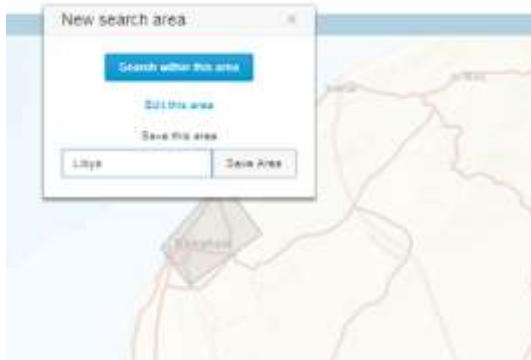


Click, drag and double click to select area

Map Layers

Using Jane's maps you can search across a number of geospatial layers, subject to your subscription access.

Events

The events contained in the Events layer include terrorism and counter terrorism events, and state and civil events that impact risk or security.

Events data can be presented as points, in thematic views, or as heatmaps. A timeline enables you to select your period of interest.

View by points



Bases

The military bases layer contains thousands of locations verified by Jane's using satellite imagery. Military layers include military airfields, naval facilities and garrisons for land forces. All locations are monitored on a rotating basis for accuracy, with changes in site or facility status updated accordingly.

For selected countries ORBAT information is available, with links to equipment profiles dependent on subscription access.

Of significance was the decision to rely upon a single Pratt & Whitney F100 turbofan rather than the twin General Electric low-bypass GE YJ101s of the Northrop design. On 13 December 1973 the YF-16 prototype (serial 72-01567) was rolled out at Fort Worth before being airlifted to Edwards Air Force Base (AFB), California, ready for its maiden flight on 2 February 1974, preceded by 'Unintentional'

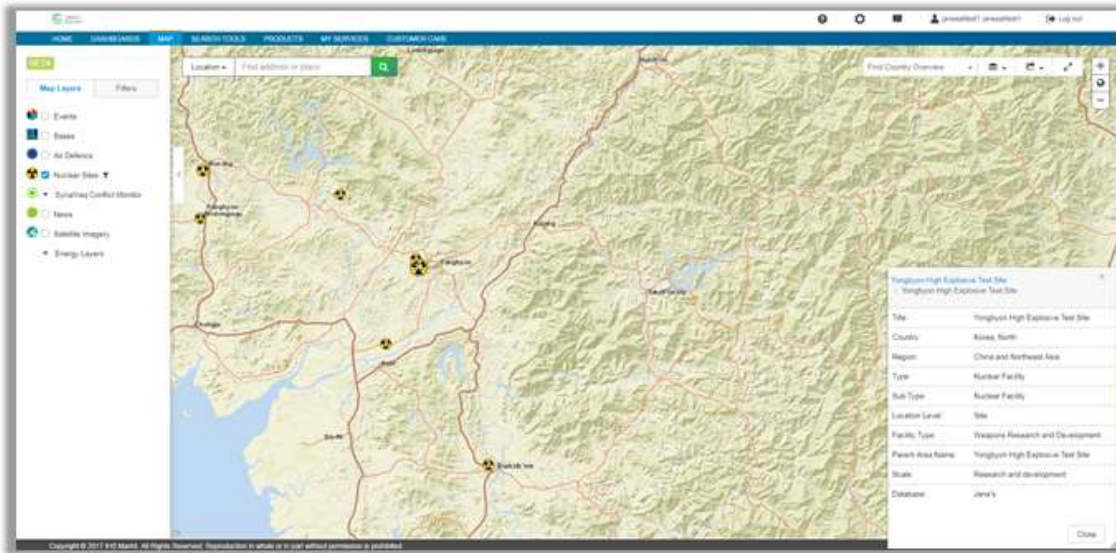
Air Defence

The air defence layers contain thousands of locations verified by Jane's using satellite imagery. Within the air defence layers, individual system components are identified, including associated radar systems and launch vehicles. All locations are monitored on a rotating basis for accuracy, with changes in site or facility updated accordingly.



Nuclear Sites

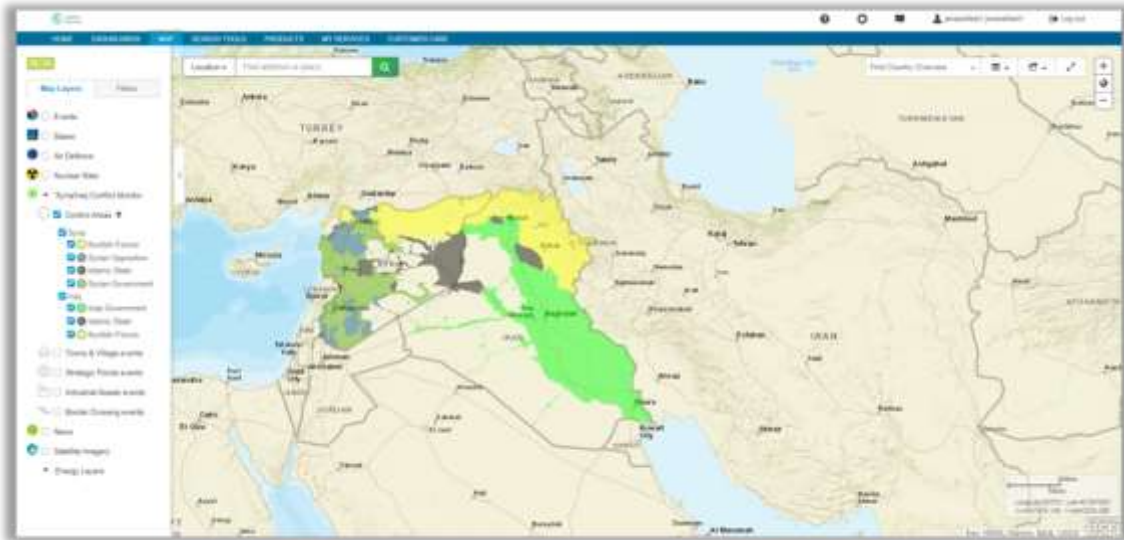
The nuclear layer provides a comprehensive geospatial listing of nuclear fuel-cycle related sites. It combines information on IAEA-declared civilian nuclear facilities – including power reactors and fuel-cycle related activities – with information on undeclared nuclear facilities for countries across the world.



Syria and Iraq Conflict Monitor

Subject to your subscription Syria and Iraq Conflict Monitor delivered geospatial data which maps the progression of the conflict in Syria and Iraq in unprecedented detail.

High resolution interactive control maps for Syria and Iraq.

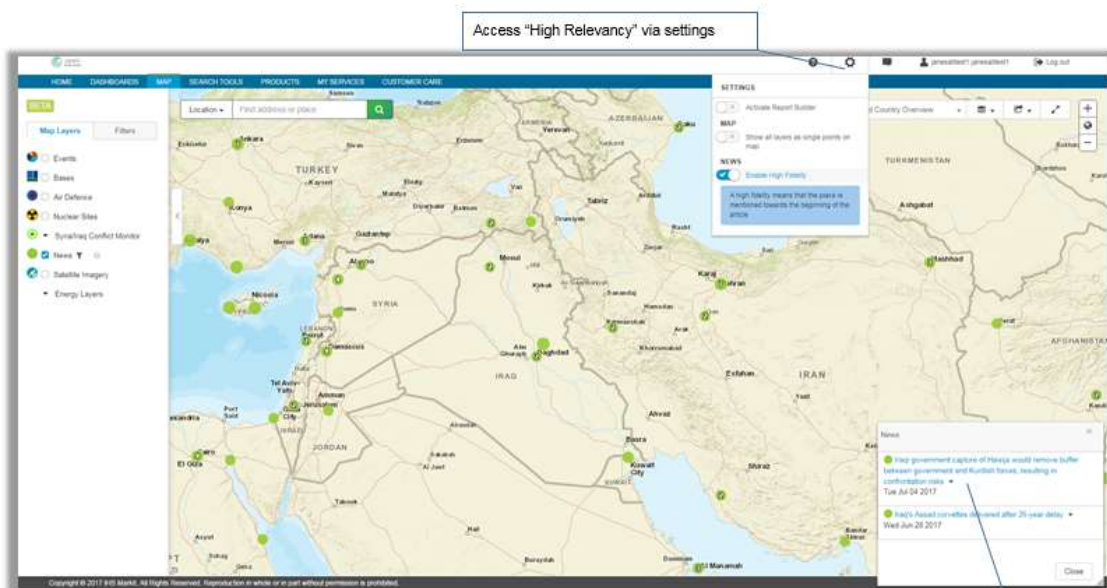


By including additional layers you can identify events associated with specific Iraqi or Syrian towns and villages, industrial assets, strategic points or border crossings. These events often provide an indication of control change.

News

Depending on your subscription access, news and analysis from leading Jane's publications including Jane's Defence Weekly, Jane's International Defence Review can be viewed as a geospatial layer.

Change your settings to turn on "High relevancy". High relevancy means that your search terms will appear near the beginning of the news article, to ensure that it is relevant. For example the location you are viewing will appear near the top of the article rather than in the footnotes.



Satellite Imagery

Jane's satellite imagery analysis delivers immediate, reliable insight into global security factors, providing validatory and supplemental support. It enables analysts to focus their effort on fewer, more important areas of interest while maintaining sight of wider security risk factors.

Country Risk scoring is now integrated into the map, you can easily link to further information covering country profile, methodology and historical chart.

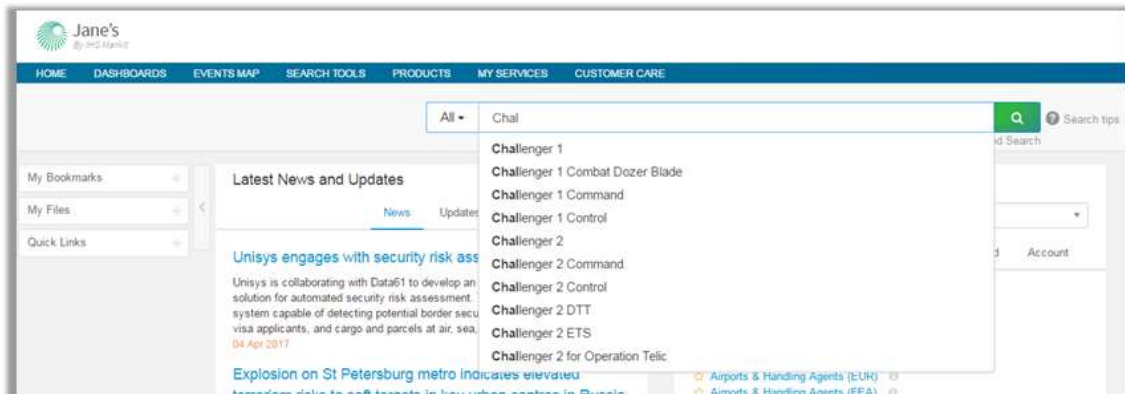

Search Terms

There are a number of ways to carry out a search, and it is important to remember that searches are contextual once you enter a product.

Auto-Fill

The search facility is a keyword operator which will auto-fill to match commonly searched terms and subject areas. We have used the keyword 'Challenger' to demonstrate the capabilities of this simple search function.



Keyword Search Syntax

The keyword search box uses the AND search operator by default, with all individual keywords or quoted phrases entered in the box being considered a search constraint.

Multiple Words

Adding multiple keywords in the box will search for documents containing those keywords anywhere in the text. e.g. tank munitions will search for documents containing tank AND munitions.

Phrases

Phrases can be included in your search by delimiting the keywords you enter with double quotation marks (" "). e.g. "tank munitions" will search only for instances of the keywords tank and munitions appearing adjacent to each other and in that sequence as a single phrase.

Boolean Operators

Keywords and phrases can be combined into search statements using Boolean operators.

- search text <AND> search text, where search text can be a keyword or "phrase" - when searching for documents containing both keywords / phrases
- search text <OR> search text, where search text can be a keyword or "phrase" - when searching for document containing either keyword / phrase

Excluding Words and Phrases

Keywords and phrases can be excluded from the search results by prefixing them with a not operator (<not>). e.g. <not> tank will search for documents that do not include the keyword tank, and <not> "tank munitions" will search for documents that do not include that phrase.

Parentheses (Operator Precedence)

By default the order of precedence is <NOT>,<AND>,<OR>,<NEAR>, this order should be changed through the use of parenthesis.

- e.g. (SHORAD <OR> "short range air defence") <AND> "United States"

Without the parentheses "short range air defence" will be joined using AND logic to "United States"

Proximity

Keywords or phrases in close proximity to other keywords or phrases can be searched for by using the format – term <NEAR> term.

- e.g. apache<NEAR> longbow

This option can be configured to operate within a range, by defining how close you want the terms to be "apache <NEAR /5> longbow" when searching for those keywords. If a range is not entered, a range of 4 is applied as a default.

Wildcards

Wildcards may be used to define search strings with variables in order to locate related keyword matches in documents. A wild card string may contain the following special characters –

- Asterisk (*) will expand the scope of your search by representing 0 or more alphanumeric characters at the beginning, middle, or end of the word, eg. Defen*e = Defense, Defence, Defensive, Defendable.
- Question Mark (?) will limit the scope of your search by representing a single alphanumeric character, eg. Defen?e = Defence, Defense. More than one (?) can be used to indicate multiple characters.

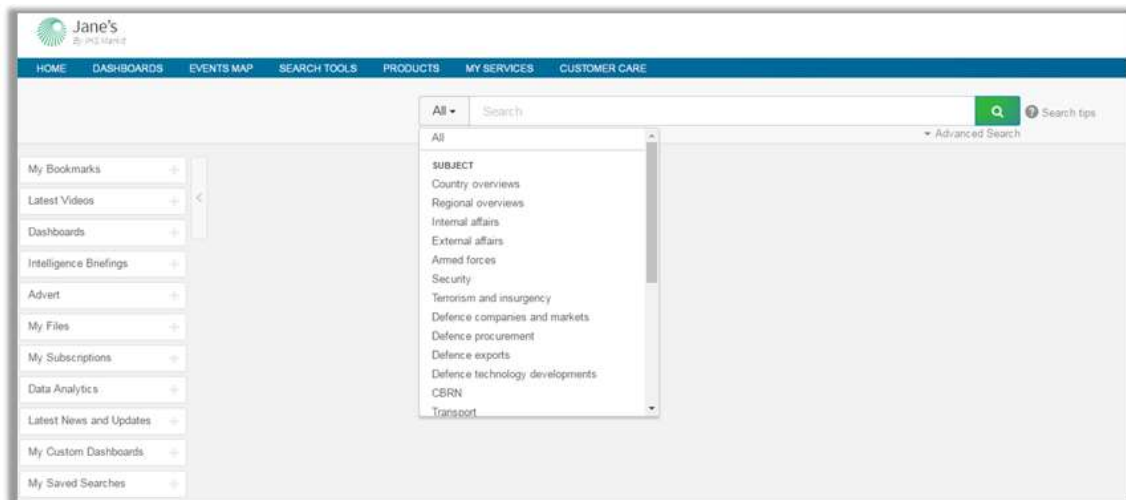
Starting a Search

This section looks at searching from the home page, advanced, contextual, and null searches.

Starting a search from the home page

When you start a search from the home page any previous search criteria you have entered will be cleared. Home page searches will also search across your subscription excluding results from Jane's Markets Forecast, Jane's Intelligence Review, Jane's Defence Procurement, Jane's Defence Budgets, Jane's Defence Sector Budgets, and Jane's Terrorism & Insurgency Centre.

Start a search by entering a search term in the search box. By default this will search your entire subscription but you can limit your search to certain subject areas using the drop down to the left of the search box.

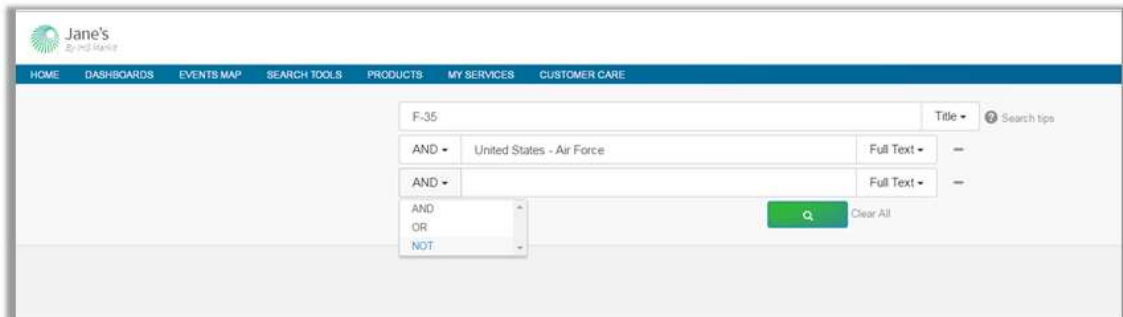


Starting a search from Advanced Search

To start an Advanced Search navigate to “Search Tools” in the top navigation and select “Advanced Search” from the menu items. Advanced search will allow you to easily build a complex search.

You can start by adding key words or phrases to the search box, you can then select from the drop down on the right whether to confine your search to the title only or full text. Click “+” to add an additional row and you can select “And”, “Or” or “Not” from the drop down to the left of the search box. This will determine the logic of your search.

You can also add additional filtering options from the list on the left hand side of the screen to further narrow your search results.



Contextual searches

Jane’s search is contextual once you enter a product area; this means that once you begin a search within a product, you will only be searching that product rather than your entire subscription.

Null searches

Using a null or blank search means that you will see all available search results without any contextual filters being applied. Simply leave the search box empty and click search. You can then refine your search by category, and filter as required.

Filtering your Search Results

The Jane's knowledge base is extremely large, with a full subscriber having access to more than 750,000 documents via main search. Whilst the best efforts are made to display the most relevant content at the top of the results list it may often be necessary to make further refinements to your search results.

A quick and easy way to refine results is to use the tabs above the search results grid. You can choose to see all results or just news, country profiles, equipment profiles and so on. Profiles will act as a point in time reference document providing in depth coverage of a piece of equipment, a country or a company. For the most up to date, breaking information you may need to refer to news and insight. For structured information, i.e. inventories information it is advisable to use the Data & Analytics tab which will mostly consist of spreadsheets.

For more advanced refining options use the filters on the left of the screen. These filters can be expanded multiple levels:

- Subjects: i.e. Armed Forces, External Affairs, Security etc.
- Equipment: i.e. C4ISR Systems, Land Vehicles etc.
- Region/Country: i.e. Middle East or France etc.
- Date Posted: date posted on the site.
- Document Type: i.e. Analysis, News, Reference etc.
- Document Format: i.e. spreadsheet, intelligence briefing
- Document Status: Active or archived
- Publication/Section: i.e. All the Worlds Aircraft, Jane's Defence Weekly etc.
- NSAG Actors: Non State Armed Groups
- Organisation: i.e. Finmeccanica, Thales, Saab, etc.

Search Results Grid

Once a search has been executed you will be taken to the search results grid. By default results are displayed by relevancy. If you enter a blank search, all documents in your subscription will be returned, with the most recent first.

Saved Searches and Email Alerts

If you have set up an individual profile you can set up saved searches.

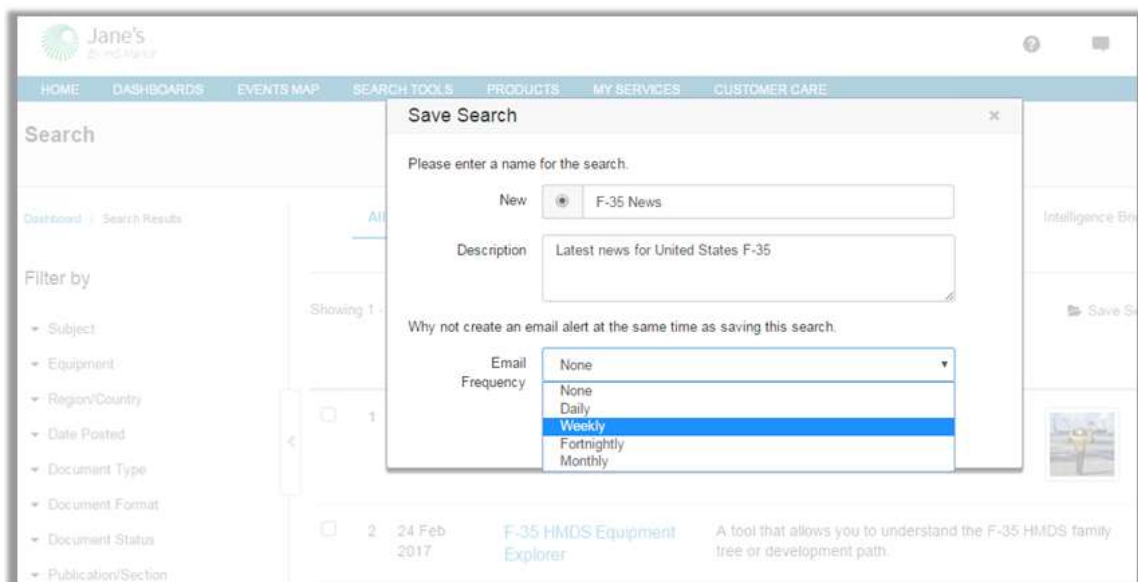
Once you have constructed a search you can choose to save that search for later reference, so that you do not need to enter regular search details again. Saved searches can also be set up as an email alert, so that you receive a regular email when new information is published that matches your search criteria.

This section demonstrates how to set up, access, and amend your saved searches and email alerts

Setting up a saved search and email alert

To set up a saved search enter all your search criteria – this can be a combination of keywords, Boolean operators and filters. Once you have selected your search options, click the “Save Search” icon at the top of the search grid. Enter a search name and description.

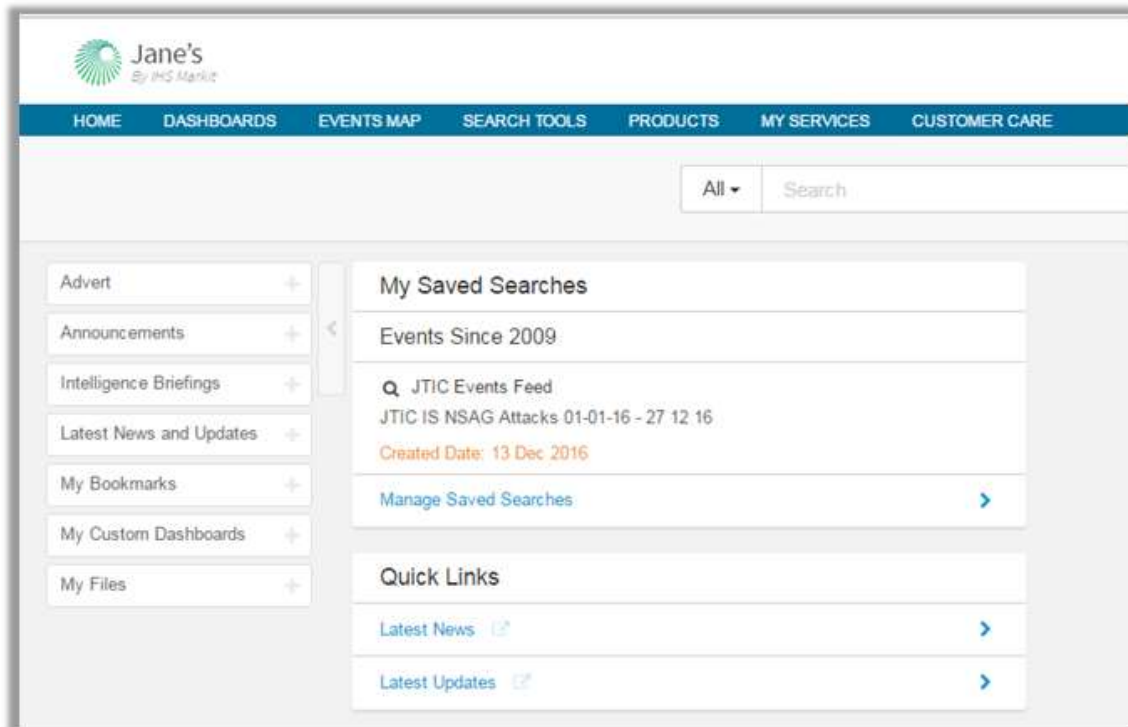
If you wish you can also turn your saved search into an email alert by selecting an email frequency. When you have finished click “Ok”.



Accessing your saved searches

You can find your email alerts, RSS feeds and saved searches in the “My Saved Searches” widget on the home page or in the “My Services” tab on the top navigation.

Clicking on the saved search will run the search for you and take you to the search results grid.



Amending your saved searches

To amend your saved searches and alerts, you can click “Manage Saved Searches” in the home page widget, or navigate to “My Services” in the top navigation and select “My Saved Searches”.

What is RSS

RSS (Really Simple Syndication) allows you to conveniently view a number of information sources (e.g. Jane's) in one place as soon as it is published, without having to visit the Jane's site. These RSS feeds are for subscribers only.

How do I start using Jane's RSS feeds?

In general, the first thing you need is something called a RSS reader. This is a piece of software that checks the feeds and lets you read any publications and articles that have been added. There are many different versions, some of which are accessed using a browser, and some of which are downloadable applications. Some recent browsers even have RSS feeds detection built into them so that when you come across an RSS feed that you want to add, you simply follow the instructions in the browser.

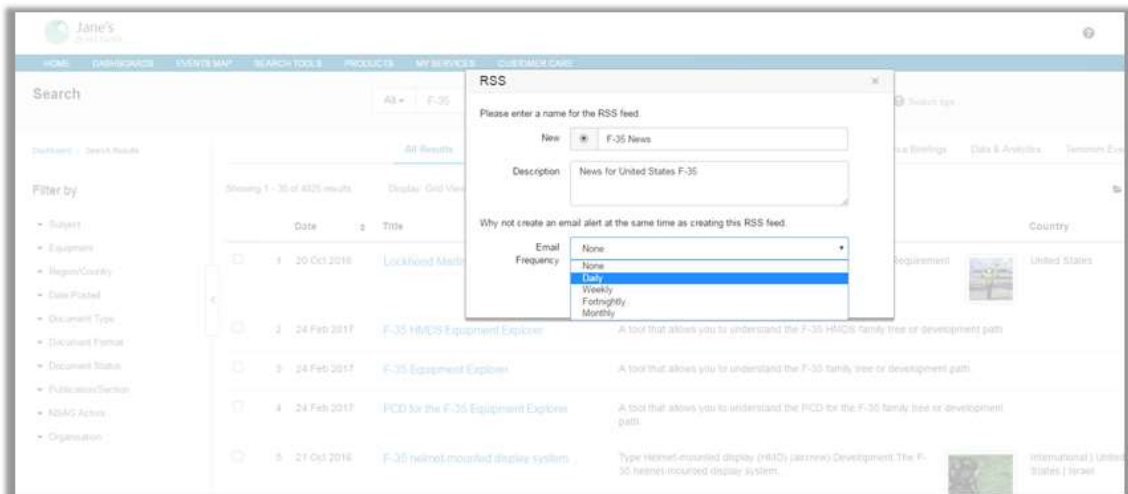
Browser-based news readers let you catch up with your RSS feed subscriptions from any computer, whereas downloadable applications let you store them on your main computer, in the same way that you either download your email using Outlook, or keep it on a web-based service like Hotmail.

Setting up an RSS Feed

To set up an RSS Feed enter all your search criteria – this can be a combination of keywords, Boolean operators and filters. Once you have selected your search options, click the “RSS” button at the top of the search grid.

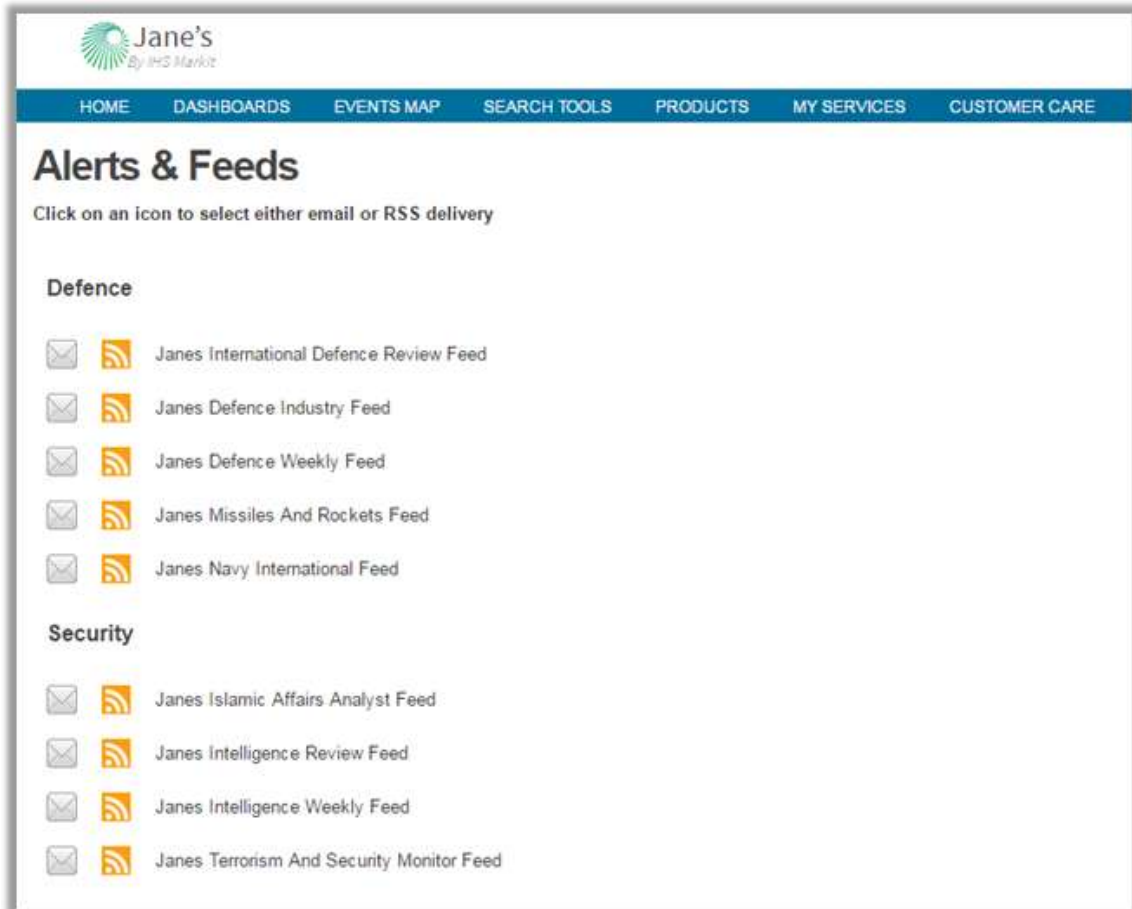
Enter your RSS Feed name and description, and select your email frequency.

You will need to have an RSS feed reader installed to view this content.



Accessing Jane's pre-determined feeds

Jane's have created a set of standard email alerts and RSS feeds. To set these up go to "My Services" in the top navigation, and select "My Alerts & Feeds". You will see a list of alerts and feeds on different topics. Click the envelope icon to set up an email alert, and the RSS feed icon to set up an RSS feed.

Viewing Documents

Once a document is opened there are options available as to how that document view is set out. Any changes you make will persist. Where a document has been added to or updated, new text is shown in green.

If you have an individual profile set up you can add your own notes to a document using the "Make a New Note" option to the right hand side of the document. You can access and manage all your notes via the "My Services" tab in the top navigation, under "My Notes".

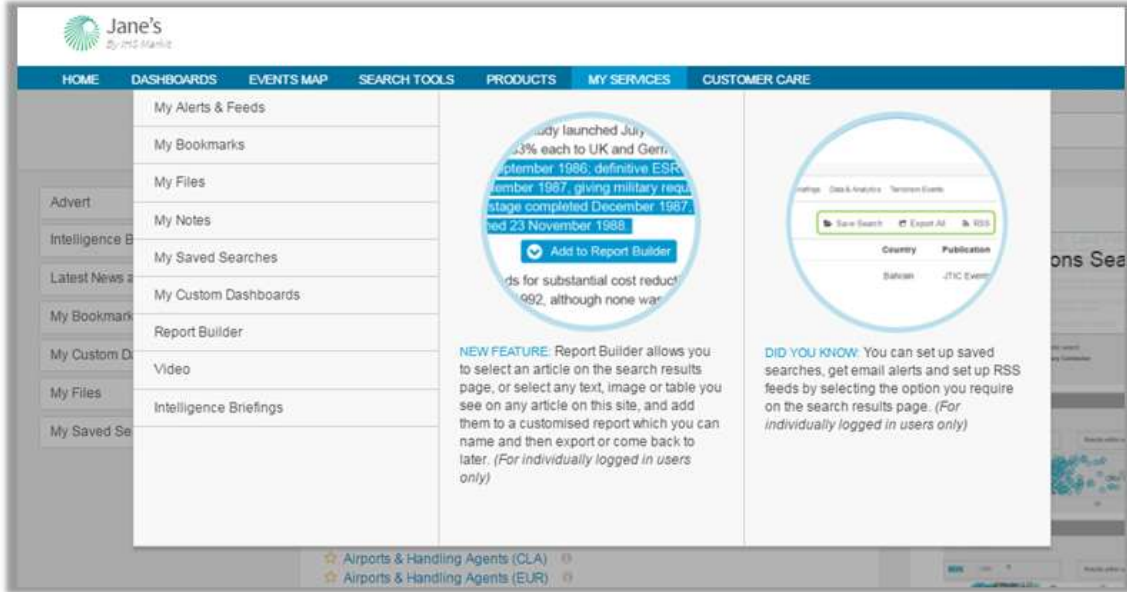

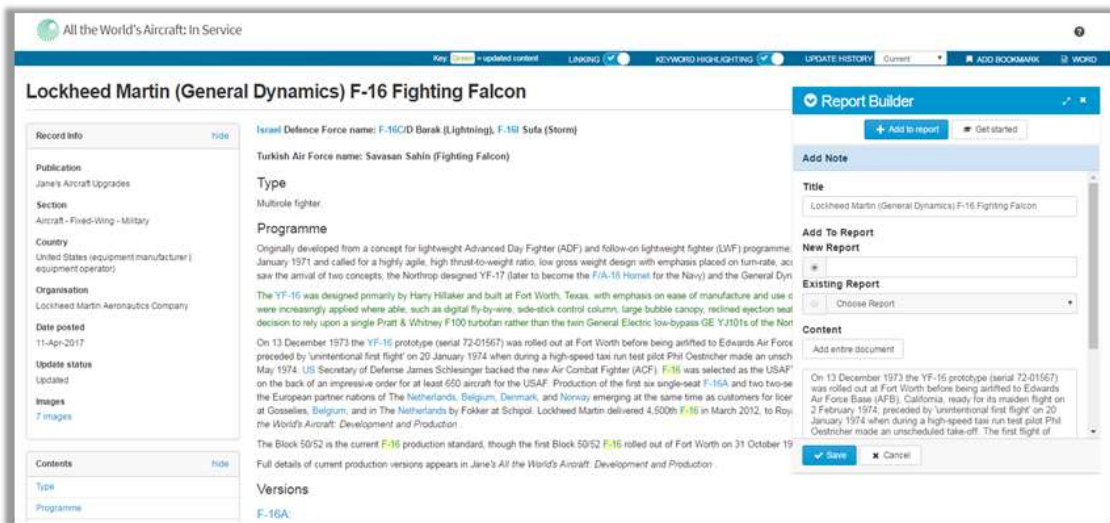

Report Builder allows you to select an article on the search results page, or select any text, image or table you see on any article on this site, and add them to a customised report which you can name and then export or come back to later.

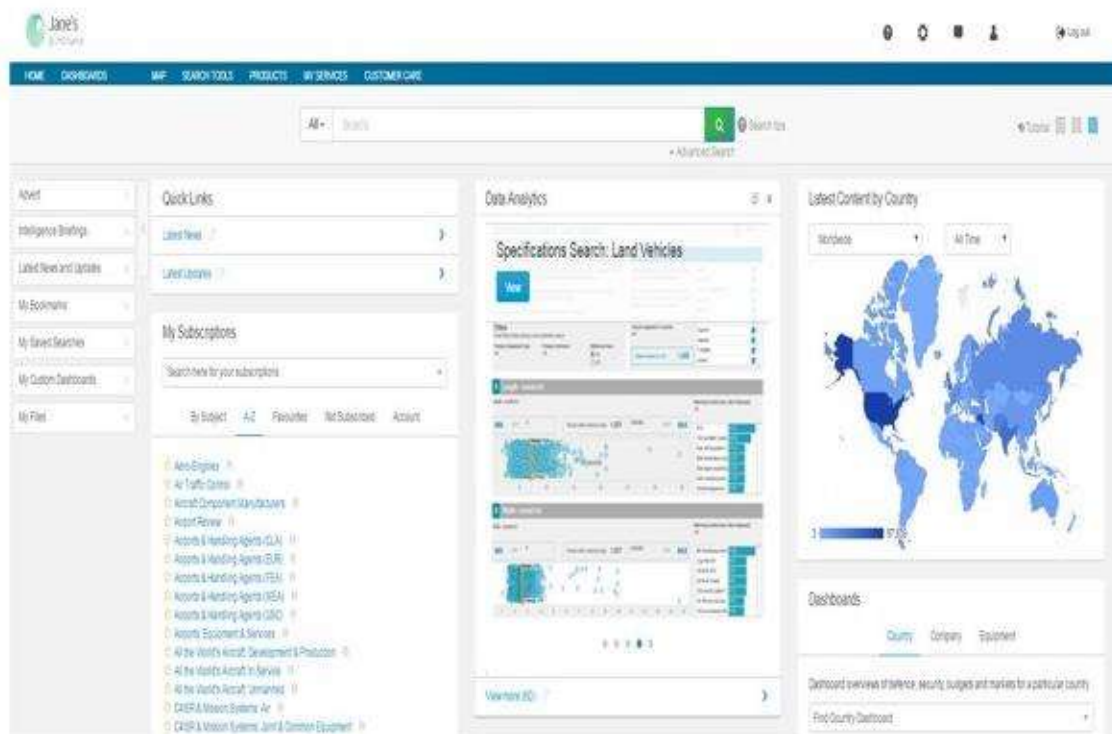
In order to export images, select "Add entire document" under the "Content" section. Any text which isn't required can be easily deleted.

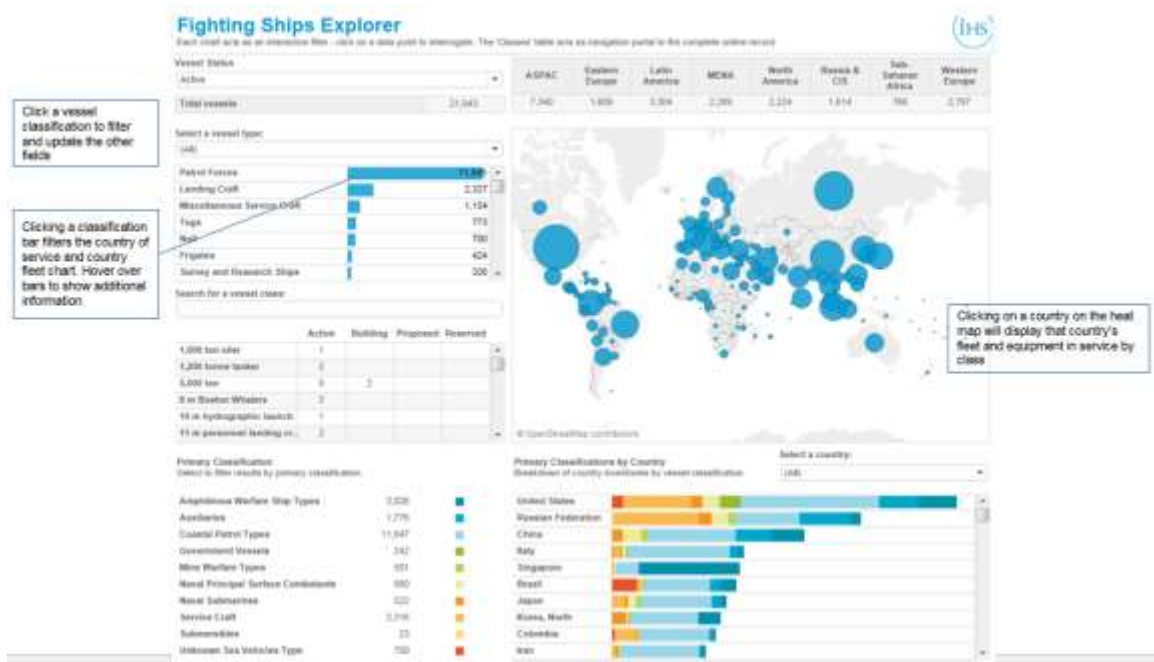

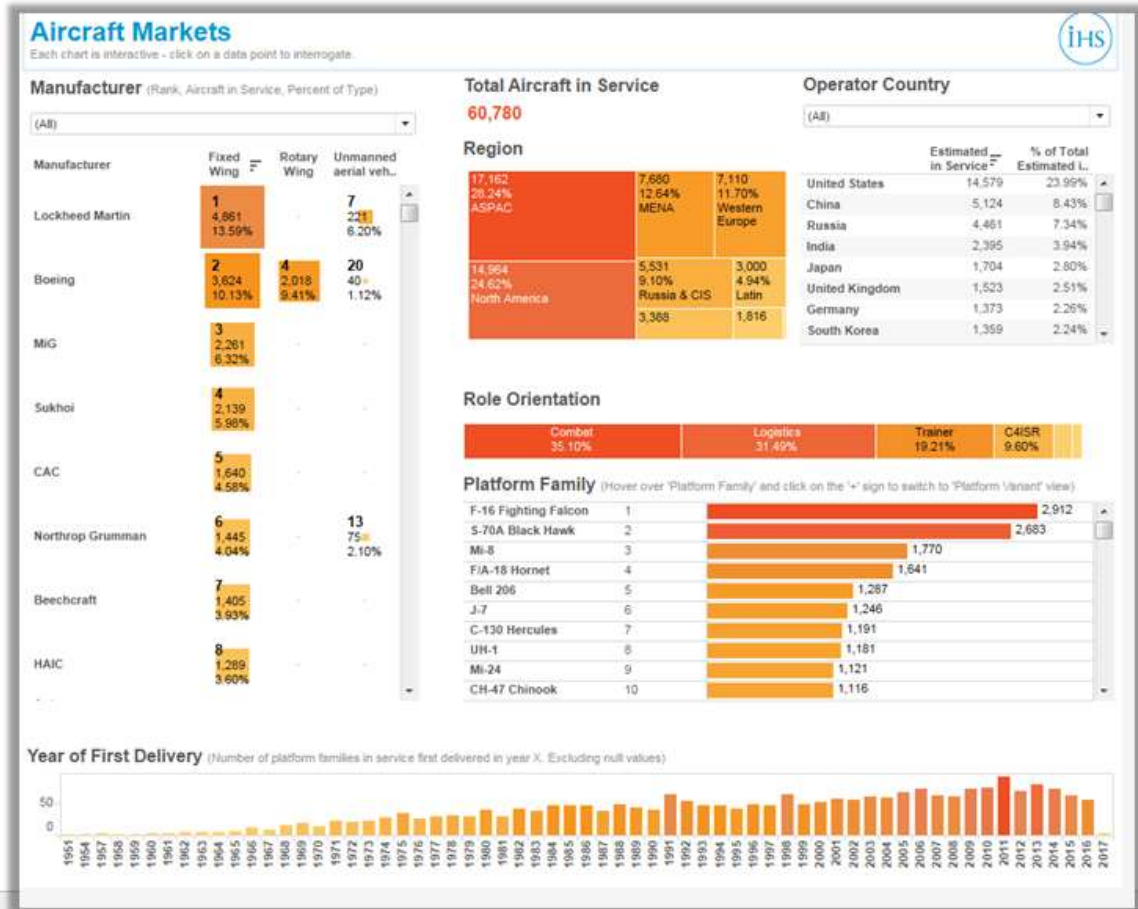

Each chart in the Aircraft Markets tool is interactive and allows you to layer multiple filters to analyse aircraft markets. Clicking multiple charts further refines your search.

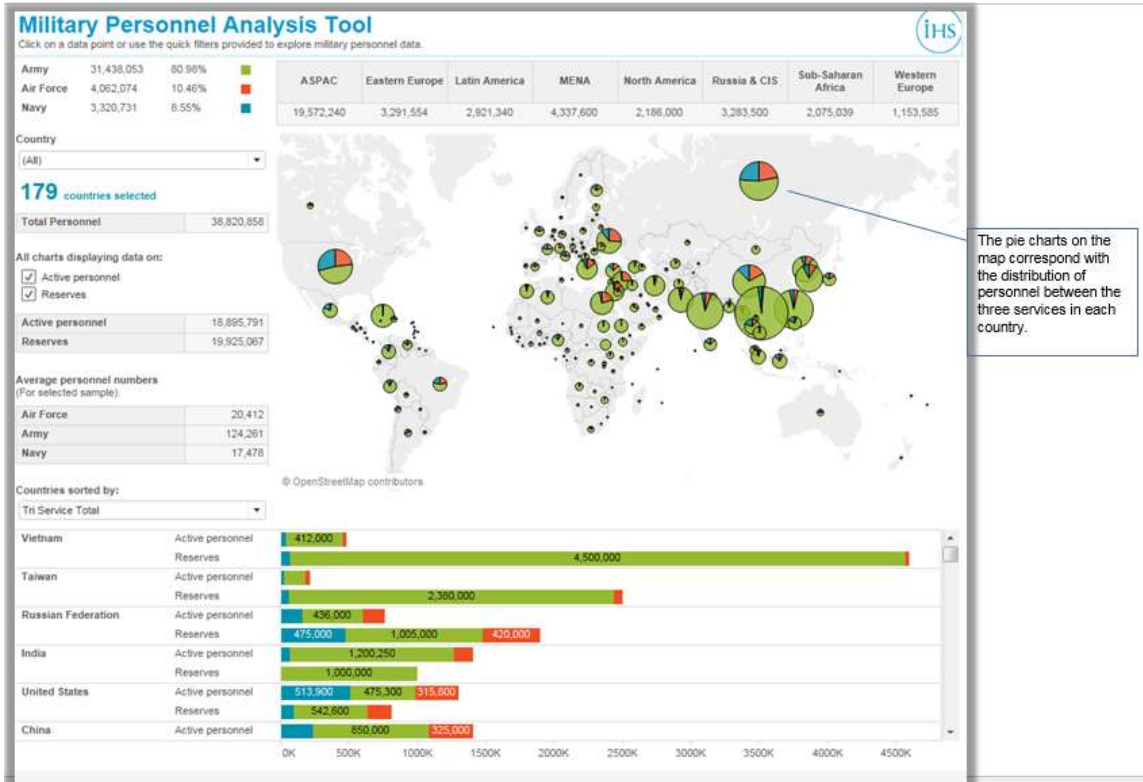


As an example, here we have selected Lockheed Martin (Manufacturer), combat aircraft (Role Orientation) in North America (Region) to see the total aircraft in service.
